2.12 How does IQAC Contribute/Monitor/Evaluate the Teaching & Learning processes:

Extensive effort has been put up by IQAC to ensure an environment to achieve excellence in all the aspects of teaching and learning and also focused on improving the quality of education and evaluation. The IQAC academic audit is carried out by the members of the IQAC. This is done in various stages.

- a) All the teaching staff members submitted semester plan for the conducting of theory and practical classes to their respective head of the departments.
- b) Monthly reports are collected from the teaching staff where in teachers give information regarding coverage of syllabus during that particular month. In case where syllabus was not covered as per schedule, the teachers were accordingly advised.
- c). At the end of the semester (during the internal audit) the internal auditors submit the monitoring sheets to the Principal who examines whether the entire syllabus has been completed as per the initial planning and appropriate steps are initiated to communicate the syllabus within the scheduled time.
- d) And also the IQAC continuously monitors the quality of teaching learning process by way of conducting Academic staff Appraisal Process at the end of every academic year. The periodic reports submitted by the IQAC to the Institutional Heads and the review meetings conducted regularly helped the

institute significantly to monitor the progress and to initiate the kind of measures that can be taken to improve the quality of teaching and learning process.
