1. INTRODUCTION

The first autonomous regulation (**K20**) of the KKR & KSR Institute of Technology and Sciences (**Subsequently referred to as KITS**) is formulated based on the guidelines of ALL INDIA COUNSIL FOR TECHICAL EDUCATION, (AICTE), NEW DELHI. Also, abide by the norms of Jawaharlal Nehru Technological University Kakinada, Kakinada. The Academic Council (AC) of this Institution has duly approved the regulation **K20**.

- 1 It is applicable to MBA program offered by the College with effect from the academic year **2020–21**.
- The regulations hereunder are subject to amendments made by the Institution's Academic Council from time to time, keeping the Board of Studies (BOS) recommendations in view. The AC will decide the batches of students already undergoing the Programme applicable to these amendments.

2. ADMISSIONS

2.1 Eligibility for Admissions

The admission procedure into MBA program adheres to the norms approved by the Government of Andhra Pradesh State from time to time, and it is carried through two modes.

- **Category-A**: The seats under which fills by the Convener, (AP-ICET).
- Category-B: The Institution fills the seats as per the norms approved by the Government of Andhra Pradesh.
- 2.2 Admission to the post graduate degree programme shall be made on the basis of either the merit rank or Percentile obtained by the qualified student in the relevant qualifying Examination/ the merit rank obtained by the qualified student in an entrance test conducted by Andhra Pradesh State Government (ICET) for MBA programme / on the basis of any other exams approved by the University, subject to reservations as laid down by the Govt. from time to time.
- 2.3 The medium of instructions for MBA Programme will be English only.

3. ACADEMIC REGULATIONS

Applicable for the students of MBA from the Academic Year 2020-21.

3.1 Duration of the Program

The duration of the program is two academic years consisting of four semesters. However, a student is permitted to complete the course work of MBA program in the stipulated time frame of **FOUR** years from the date of joining.

3.2 Minimum Instruction Days

Each semester consists of a minimum of ninety instruction days.

3.3 Program Credits

MBA program is designed to have a total of **102** credits and the student shall have to complete the two year course work and earn 102 credits for the award of MBA Degree.

3.4 Credit definition

Credit means quantified and recognized learning. Credit is measured in terms of contact hours per week in a semester and is summarized in Table.

4. ATTENDANCE REGULATIONS

- 1 A student shall be eligible to write semester examinations if he acquires a minimum of 75% of attendance in aggregate of all the subjects/courses, and with minimum 50% in each and every course including practicals.
- 2 Condonation of shortage of attendance in aggregate up to 10% (65% and above and below 75%) in each semester shall be granted by the College Academic Committee.
- 3 Shortage of Attendance **below** 65% in aggregate shall not be condoned and not eligible to write their end semester examination of that class.
- 4 Students whose shortage of attendance is not condoned in any semester are not eligible to write their end semester examination of that class.
- 5 A prescribed fee shall be payable towards condonation of shortage of attendance.
- A student shall not be promoted to the next semester unless; he satisfies the attendance requirement of the present semester, as applicable. They may seek re-admission into that semester when offered next.

5. COURSE STRUCTURE:

Dual specialization is given in the program. A student can opt any two specializations from the existing options subject to the minimum of 30% of the total students in the class. The following table depicts the division of credits.

6. EXAMINATIONS AND SCHEME OF EVALUATION

6.1 Theory Courses

Each theory course shall be evaluated for a total of 100 marks, consisting of 30 marks for internal assessment and 70 marks for end semester examination.

Internal Assessment

- I. 30 marks for internal assessment, 10 marks are for seminar and presentation and 20 marks for descriptive exam.
- II. There are two mid examinations consists of presentations for 10 marks and descriptive for 20 marks. The mid (descriptive) exams should be conducted for 40 marks and be reduced to 20 marks.
- III. 10 marks for presentation (5 marks are for report content and 5 marks are for presentation).
- IV. Each mid-term examination is conducted for 40 marks with two hours (120mins) duration. Each mid-term examination consists of three questions. The questions asking from unit I&II should have (a) & (b) carries 8 marks each and only one question should be asked from first half of the unit III it also carries 8 marks. Two units carry equal marks where as third unit carries half of the weightage all the questions need to be answered. The same pattern should be followed in mid II also.
- V. The final marks are the sum of average of two mid-term examinations for 20 marks and 10 marks for presentation.

External Assessment

The semester end examination shall be conducted for duration of three hours. It can be divided as part A, B and C. Part A consists of 5 questions, one question must be from each unit, carries 2 marks. Part B consists of 5 questions one question must be from each unit, each carries 10 marks. All questions are to be answered and for each question has "either or" option. Part C is a case study carries 10 marks, which is compulsory, total becomes 70 marks.

6.2 Laboratory Course

I. For practical subjects the distribution shall be 20 marks for Internal Evaluation and 30 marks for the end semester examinations. There shall be continuous evaluation by the internal subject teacher during the semester for 20 internal marks. Out of which 10 marks for lab exam, 10 marks shall be for day- to-day performance (5 marks for day-to-day observation and 5 marks for Record) at the end of semester.

II. End semester laboratory examination shall be conducted for 30 marks with two Examiners, one of them being the Laboratory Class Teacher or teacher of the respective college and the second examiner shall be appointed by the Principal from the panel of examiners submitted by the department, with a break-up marks of Procedure-5, Experimentation-15, Results-5, Vivavoce-5.

6.3 Skill oriented course.

• The examination for skill oriented courses shall be conducted internally for 50 marks basing on the day-to-day performance in different activities.

6.4 Internship

- The student shall be permitted to undergo an internship program outside the campus for a period of ten days. The student will be allowed after taking the mid-I examinations and supposed to submit before the commencement of mid-II examinations. The internship shall be evaluated on the basis of the report he/she submits.
- The internship shall be evaluated internally for 20 marks and external 30 marks. The internal 20 marks shall be awarded after presenting the project internally. External 30 marks will be awarded 10 marks for documentation and 20 marks for viva-voce examination.

7. PROJECT WORK

- I. The final project work shall be carried out after completion of second semester and will be evaluated for 100 marks.
- II. The project shall be evaluated after completion of the fourth semester examinations.
- III. Out of 100 marks, 50 marks shall be for dissertation and 50 marks for the project Viva-Voce. Both are evaluated by the Board of Evaluators (BOE). BOE, which comprises of External Examiner appointed/nominated by the chief examiner, Head of the Department and Internal project guide.
- IV. Each student shall give one internal seminar (pre talk) on the topic of his/her project as a prerequisite for submission of the final project report.
- V. He needs to submit plagiarism report (not exceeding 30% similarity) along with the guide certificate in the final project report.
- VI. The student should get a minimum of 50% aggregate marks, otherwise if the student is unable to secure the above specified percentage he/she has to resubmit within the three months with the modifications.

8. ELIGIBILITY FOR AWARD OF MBA DEGREE

- a) A student will be declared eligible for the award of the MBA Degree if he fulfills the following academic regulations. Pursued a course of study for not less than two academic years and not more than four academic years.
- b) Registered for 102 credits and secured 102 credits.
- c) Students, who fail to complete their Two years Course of study within Four years or fail to acquire the 102 Credits for the award of the degree within four academic years from the year of their admission shall forfeit their seat in MBA course and their admission shall stand cancelled.

9. CRITERIA FOR PASSING A COURSE AND AWARD OF GRADES

9.1 Criteria for Passing a Course

- I. A candidate shall be deemed to have secured the minimum academic requirement in a subject if he secures a minimum of 40% of marks in the End semester Examination and a minimum aggregate of 50% of the total marks in the End Semester Examination and Internal Evaluation taken together.
- II. In case the candidate does not secure the minimum academic requirement in any subject as specified above, he has to re-appear for the End semester Examination in that subject. A candidate shall be given one chance to re-register for each subject the internal marks secured by a candidate are less than 50% and has failed in the end examination. In such a case, the

candidate must re-register for the subject(s) and secure the required minimum attendance. The candidate's attendance in the re-registered subject(s) shall be calculated separately to decide upon his eligibility for writing the end examination in those subject(s). In the event of the student taking another chance, his internal marks and end examination marks obtained in the previous attempt shall stand cancelled. For re-registration the candidates have to apply to the college by paying the requisite fees and get approval from the Principal before the start of the semester in which the re-registration is required.

9.2 Method of Awarding Letter Grade and Grade Points for a Course

• A letter grade and grade points will be awarded to a student in each course based on his performance as per the grading systemgiven below.

- The following procedure is to be adopted to compute the Semester Grade Point Average(SGPA) and Cumulative Grade Point Average(CGPA):
- The **SGPA** is the ratio of sum of the product of the number of credits with the grade points scored by a student in all the courses taken by a student and the sum of the number of credits of all the courses undergone by a student, i.e
- SGPA (Si) = \sum (Ci X Gi) / \sum Ci
- Where Ci is the number of credits of the ith course and Gi is the grade point scored by the student in the ith course.

Computation of CGPA

- The **CGPA** is also calculated in the same manner taking into account all the courses undergone by a student over allthe semester of a Programme, i.e.
- CGPA = \sum (Ci X Si) / \sum Ci
- Where Si is the SGPA of the ith semester and Ci is the total number of credits in that semester.
- The SGPA and CGPA shall be rounded off to 2 decimalpoints and reported in the transcripts.
- Equivalent Percentage = $(CGPA 0.75) \times 10$

10. AWARD OF DEGREE AND CLASS

After a student has satisfied the requirements prescribed for the completion of the program and is eligible for the award of MBA Degree he shall be placed in one of the following fourclasses:

11. TRANSITORY REGULATIONS

12. CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE

Students admitted to KITS must abide by the code of conduct and discipline of the College and which will be updated from time to time.

- The academic regulation should be read as a whole for any interpretation.
- In case of any doubt or ambiguity in interpreting the above rules, the Principal's decision shall be final and ratified by the Governing Body's Chairman.
- The College may change or amend the academic regulations or syllabi at any time. The changes or amendments made shall apply to all the students with effect from the dates notified by the College.
